

## FIS Political Contributions and Expenditures Report – 2024

FIS makes political contributions in compliance with its Political Activities Policy (the “Policy”) and applicable law. The Policy contains policies and procedures for making, with corporate funds or assets, contributions and expenditures to participate or intervene in any campaign on behalf of (or in opposition to) any candidate for public office, or otherwise influence the general public or any segment thereof, with respect to an election, ballot initiative or referendum. It is publicly available on FIS’ website.

This report, which has been reviewed by the Corporate Governance, Nominating and Sustainability Committee of the Board of Directors, shows political contributions made by FIS during calendar year 2024, as well as the non-deductible portion of payments to trade associations engaged in advocacy of \$50,000 or more and payments to other tax-exempt organizations that may be used for political purposes.
